Interaction with students and Faculty by Prof. Ajit K Chaturvedi



rof. Ajit K. Chaturvedi, Professor Department of EE, IIT Kanpur and former Director IIT Roorkee visited JKLU on January 18, 2023. He interacted with students and faculty on various topics of interest. The session with students was very interactive and started with theme "Giving Words to our Thoughts", where students shared their concerns on various academic and co-curricular aspects. The session was attended by over 65 students of university and lasted for an hour. A one hour faculty interaction followed this, which was attended by 20 faculty members.



AI: The Past, The Present, and the Future: Dr. Verma

An academic forum session by Dr. Kshitiz Verma was conducted on February 10, 2023. The title of the talk was 'Al: The Past, The Present, and the Future'. Dr Verma highlighted the significance of AI Learning in contemporary times. It emphasized AI as deep learning and taking rational decisions. He posed in-depth curiosity and questioned what Al can do? Why Al has been proactively engaged even in the recruitment and selection process and in the predictive policymaking. However, Dr Verma highlighted Al limitations, explaining how AI amplify human biases in all aspects through diverse stereotyped examples. Despite multiple rules and regulations to regulate the use of AI, Dr Verma pointed out that humans are still not ready to use AI in every aspects. Moreover, the implementation of acts, for instance, the EU Artificial Intelligence Act, has neither eliminated the amplification of human biases nor reduced the risk level on the use of AI.

Academic Forum on A Salted Peanut: Translating Metaphor and Humour



n academic forum session by Dr Saurabh Singanapalli was conducted on March 3, 2023. The title of the talk was 'A Salted Peanut: Translating Metaphor and Humour'. Dr Saurabh discussed how translation is an important component of communication, specifically when it comes to the sharing of ideas across distinct cultures and distant geographical locations. One of the enduring challenges in translation concerns he pointed is the effective reworking of metaphor and humour from one language to another, such that the intent and effect of the original message is replicated as closely as possible. Dr Saurabh listed the broad concerns in the area, with examples of effective and less-effective translations, focus on techniques of translating humour and metaphor, and initiate a discussion on possible future challenges, as human language continues to evolve. In the end, he also emphasize on the study of translation as an area of interdisciplinary exploration.

She enunciated the role of individuals to uphold the democratic nature of the state and the Constitution of India. The talk highlighted the values of citizenship rights, civil and academic freedoms, and the dangers of misinformation and fake news.

They were all very amused to see them through the binoculars and were very fascinated by their magnificence. The event was a great success, with more than 20 participants in attendance. Many participants expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to observe the moon and so many satellites in the sky and learn more about astronomy. They appreciated the friendly and supportive atmosphere created by the organizers and the team of amateur astronomers. 'The Yellow Wallpaper', a 1892 short story by Charlotte Perkins Gilman, has the structure and style of a diary. It details the deterioration of a woman's mental health while she is on a "rest cure" on a rented summer country estate with her family. Her obsession with the yellow wallpaper in her bedroom marks her descent into psychosis from her depression throughout the story. Through a series of short instalments, students learnt more about the narrator's situation and her treatment at the hands of her doctor husband and her sister-in-law. The Yellow Wallpaper' is so unsettling because it plays

with established Gothic horror conventions and then subverts them in order to expose the misguided medical practices used in an attempt to 'treat' or 'cure' women who are suffering from mental or nervous disorders. It has become a popular feminist text about the male mistreatment of women partly because the



'villain', the narrator's husband John, is acting out of a genuine (if hubristic) belief that he knows what's best for her. The whole field of nineteenth-century patriarchal society and the way it treats women thus comes under scrutiny, in a story that is all the more powerful for refusing to preach, even while it lets one such mistreated woman speak for herself. The participants shared their perspectives and experiences on the same issue. There were discussions around the situation of women in the current times and how they are treated by the society. With this discussion, students tried to be conscious of such occurrences in their surroundings and vicinity. They also talked about the importance of empathy in such situations. There were around 25 student participants for the discussion.

CRY Workshop on 'Digital Media and the Safety of Children and Adolescents'



he Centre for Communication and Critical Thinking at JK Lakshmipat University, in collaboration with CRY - Child Rights and You, organised a workshop on 'Digital Media and the Safety of Children and Adolescents', on Saturday, March 18, 2023. The objective behind the day-long workshop was to initiate the discussion on this very relevant and sensitive issue among the students who would be responsible for shaping the future in different capacities. The speakers at the workshop were Dr. Debarati Dhar, Manager (Media Advocacy), CRY, and Ms. Ragini Pant, Senior Manager (Research), CRY, and who leveraged their vast experience and knowledge of the domain to help the attending students understand and engage with important questions and ideas related to online safety. Dr. Debarati Dhar started the discussion by touching on a broad selection of related topics: constructs of digital safety, the notion of online risk and trust, the idea of the term "child labour" often being related to the informal sector alone, traffickers luring children through online platforms, and cyber-bullying, among others. She pointed out complexities of the online space: for instance, how survivors of abuse in the offline space sometimes become perpetrators in the online space. She encouraged the participants to share their own experiences, or those that they knew of from within their circles, to make the session more participatory and authentic. Following on from the given examples, she asked them to consider why we often feel apprehensive talking about such incidents with parents, and highlighted the need for sensitivity when it came to listening to those who might have gone through such experiences. In the next session, the speaker shared the empirical findings of a recently concluded research study by CRY and Chanakya National Law University, Patna, titled "POCSO and Beyond: Understanding Online Safety during COVID". The need for the study was highlighted: although laws and acts like CSEA and POCSO exist on paper, their implementation needs to be studied and examined in detail. Often, even media and organisations that work with children and their parents do not have the right data. There is a lack of credible information, especially from studies conducted in the Indian context. In this session, following a discussion on the stakeholders, the parameters and the design of the study, key findings were shared, including the fact that child trafficking actually increased during the COVID-19 pandemic, through the use of online spaces. It was highlighted that, overall, the study actually resulted in more questions being raised about the safety of children online. To allow for greater engagement with the ideas discussed, the participants were asked to work in groups of around 5-6 people and prepare a visual representation/poster of their understanding of how child sexual abuse operates, especially online. The session was attended by around 125 first-year students from the B.Tech. programme, who participated enthusiastically in the discussion and asked pertinent questions.

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


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








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
