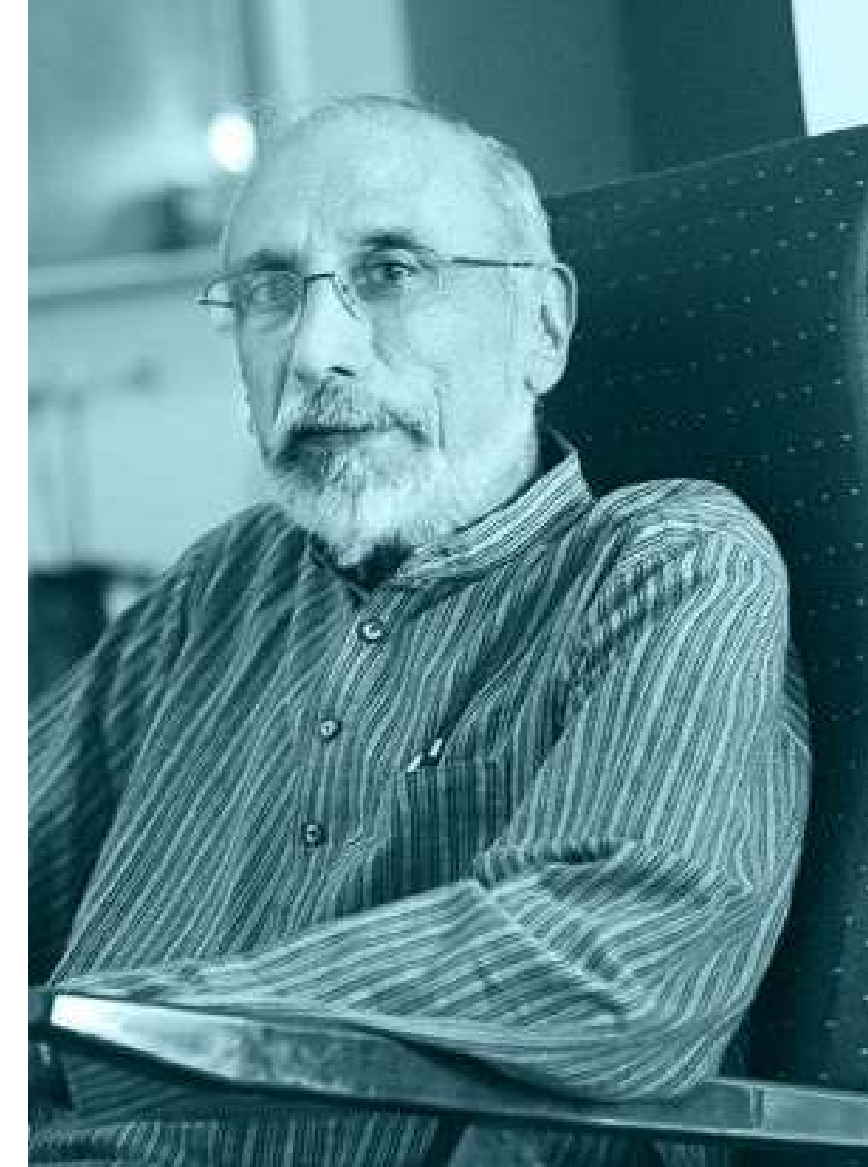
“ Every year on November 9, the Institute of Design, JK Lakshimpat University celebrates Design Guru Day, in honour of Professor MP Ranjan, one of India’s design evangelists who not only made a substantial difference through his design practices, but also nurtured generations of designers who followed in his footsteps.

To continue his legacy and remember him on his birthday, the Institute of Design, JKLU felicitates one like him, a mentor, a guide, an evangelist, a designer and most of all an educator who has impacted the minds of young design students. Some of the past recipients of Design Guru Day include Judy Frater, Don Norman, Vikas Satwalekar.

This year we honor Prof. Ashoke Chatterjee who was once the executive director of National Institute of Design, and has also been a senior faculty advisor for design management and communication. He has been a distinguished fellow at NID until his retirement in 2001 and dedicated years of service as honorary president of the Crafts Council of India. He is also a member of Aid to Artisans, a US based non-profit organization that offers practical assistance to artisans worldwide. He continues to work as a consultant in India to this date. His work today mostly centers around water management and environmental issues.

On Design Guru Day 2022, Prof. Ashoke Chatterjee will be delivering the MP Ranjan Memorial Lecture on ‘Indian purpose and Indian hope. Design education after 50 years.’ The event will be hosted in the lush green campus of JK Lakshimpat University and attended by design stalwarts across the country. 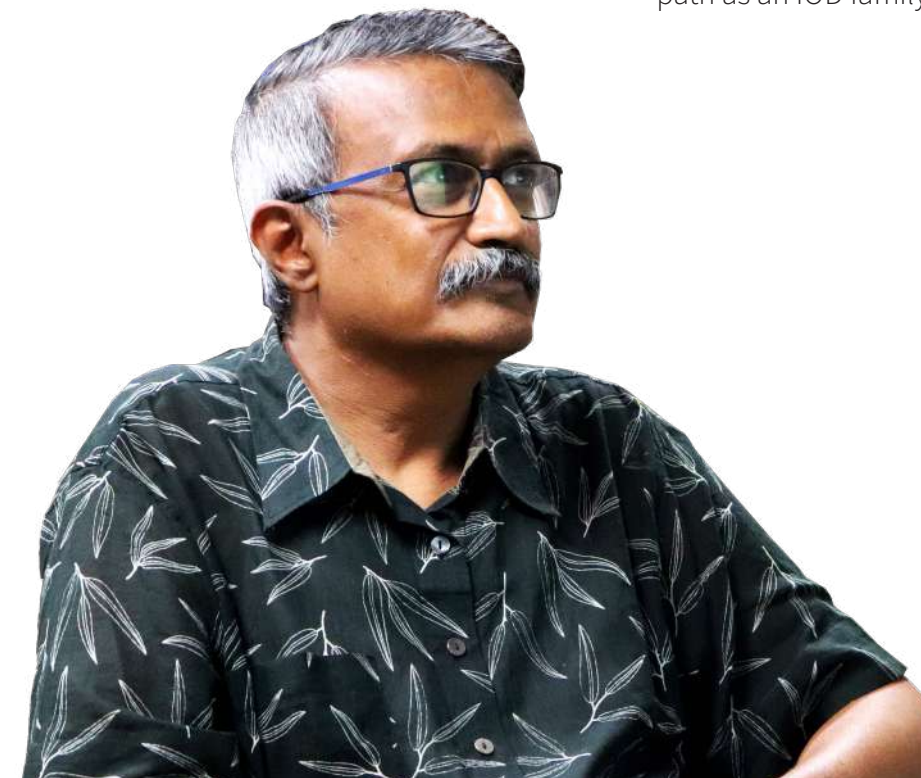
Swarnima Dwivedi is a PG from NIFT and is joining as the first Academic Associate of the group. Welcome Swarnima.

Gunjan Mudgal is the new Programme manager who just completed her studies in Italy. This is her first job, so welcome to the family.

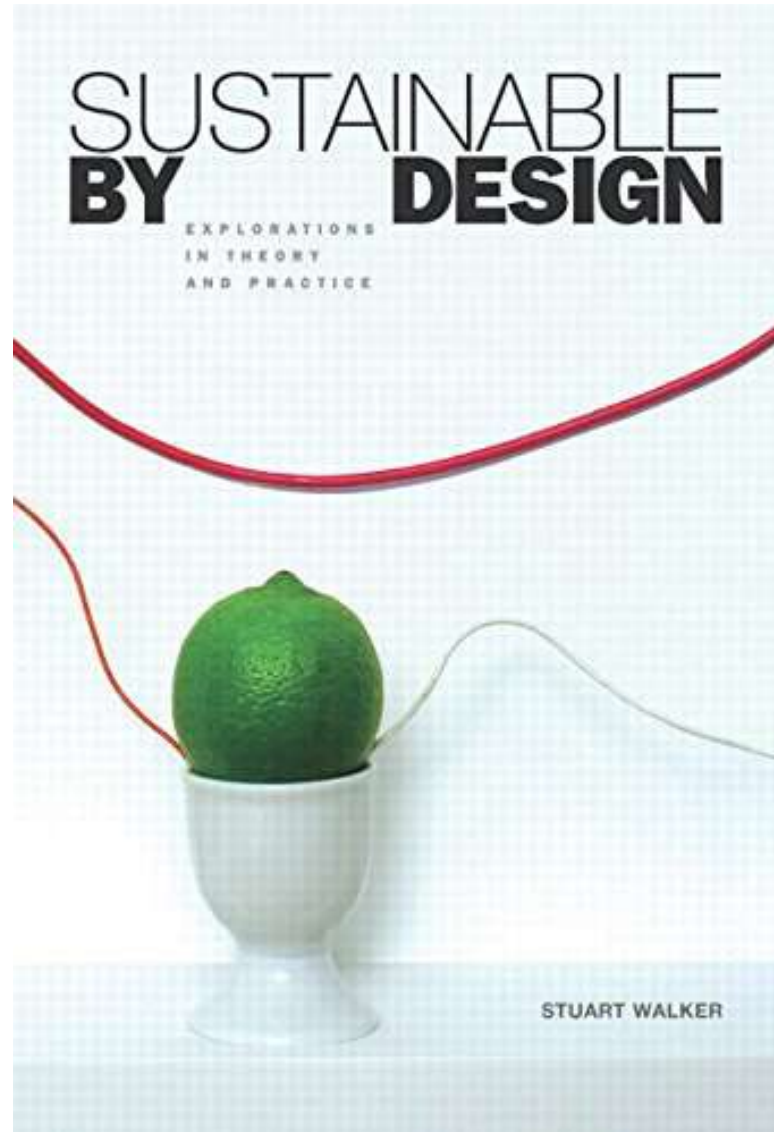

• VISUALIZATION WITH IMRAN BEG



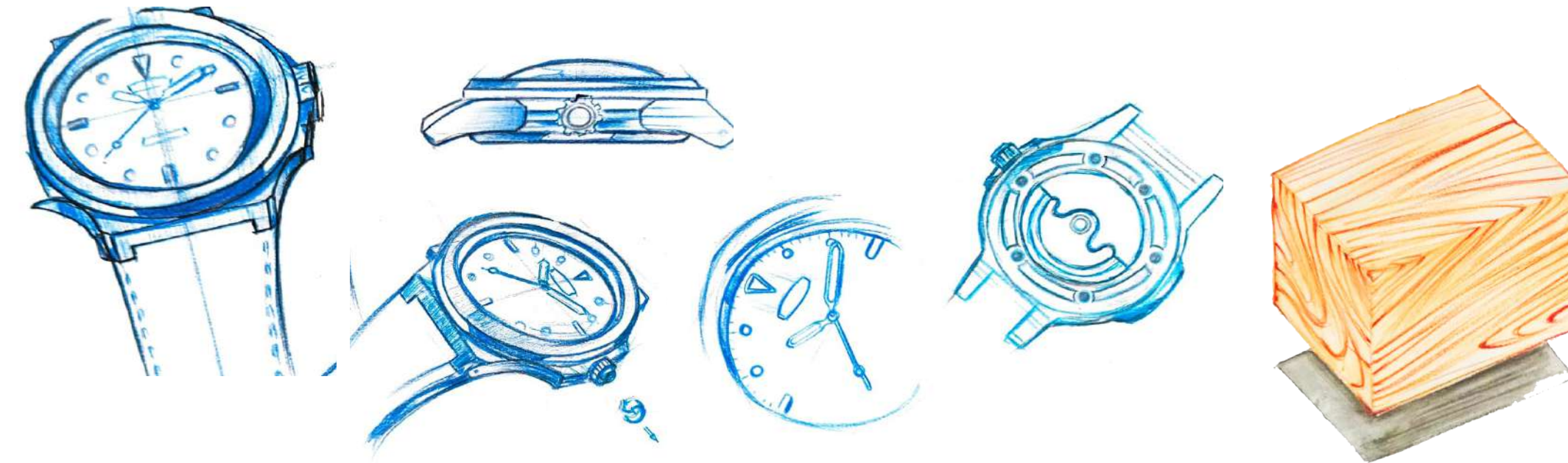
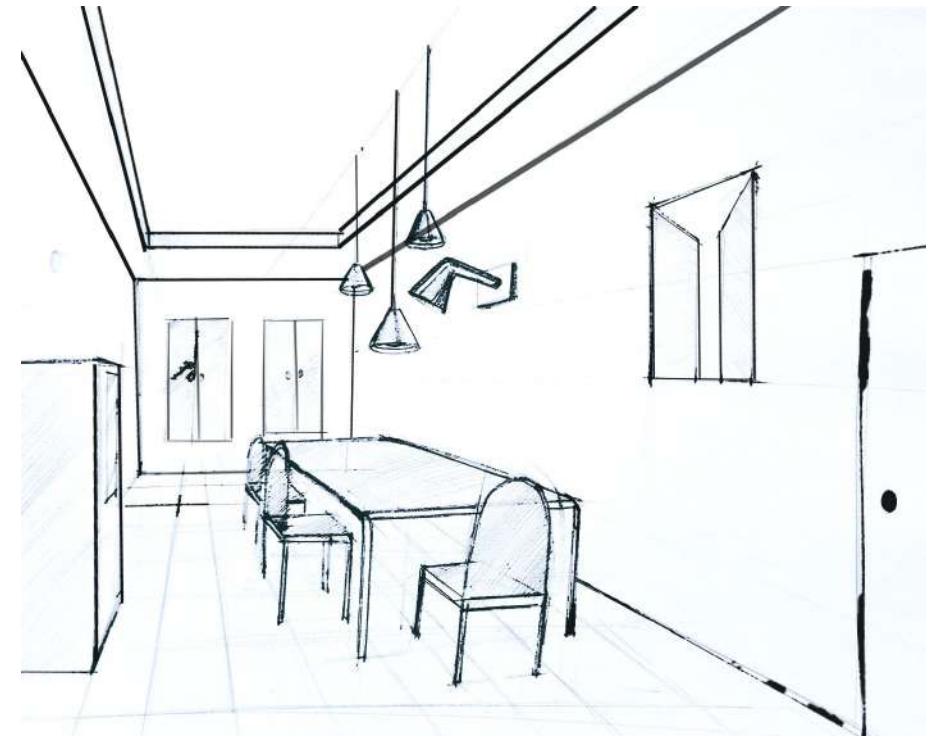

This is a unique organization owned by 75 differently-abled women. They specialize in making simple products like handmade paper, paper mache and tailoring small goodies. I focused mainly on identifying a product line for corporate gifting which also aligns with their brand identity to gain a competitive advantage.

I chose products like bags, flower pots, penholder and dairy and when I started making these products, I faced practical challenges. Therefore, I started observing again and noticed that their jute tailoring machine are not able to produce adequately. Finding solution for this problem was my greatest achievement there as I introduced a new type of stitching technique for them, which is now being used in the company to make laminated jute products and at cheaper price and more efficiently.

I'm thankful to Bala sir for sharing this job profile with me and spreading awareness about it. This internship also helped me explore a distinctive corporate structure where everyone's contribution to the company is equal.

I was also happy to know that my products were liked by people there even though tailoring was not my forte and my stitching techniques is also been taught professionally by the women there.

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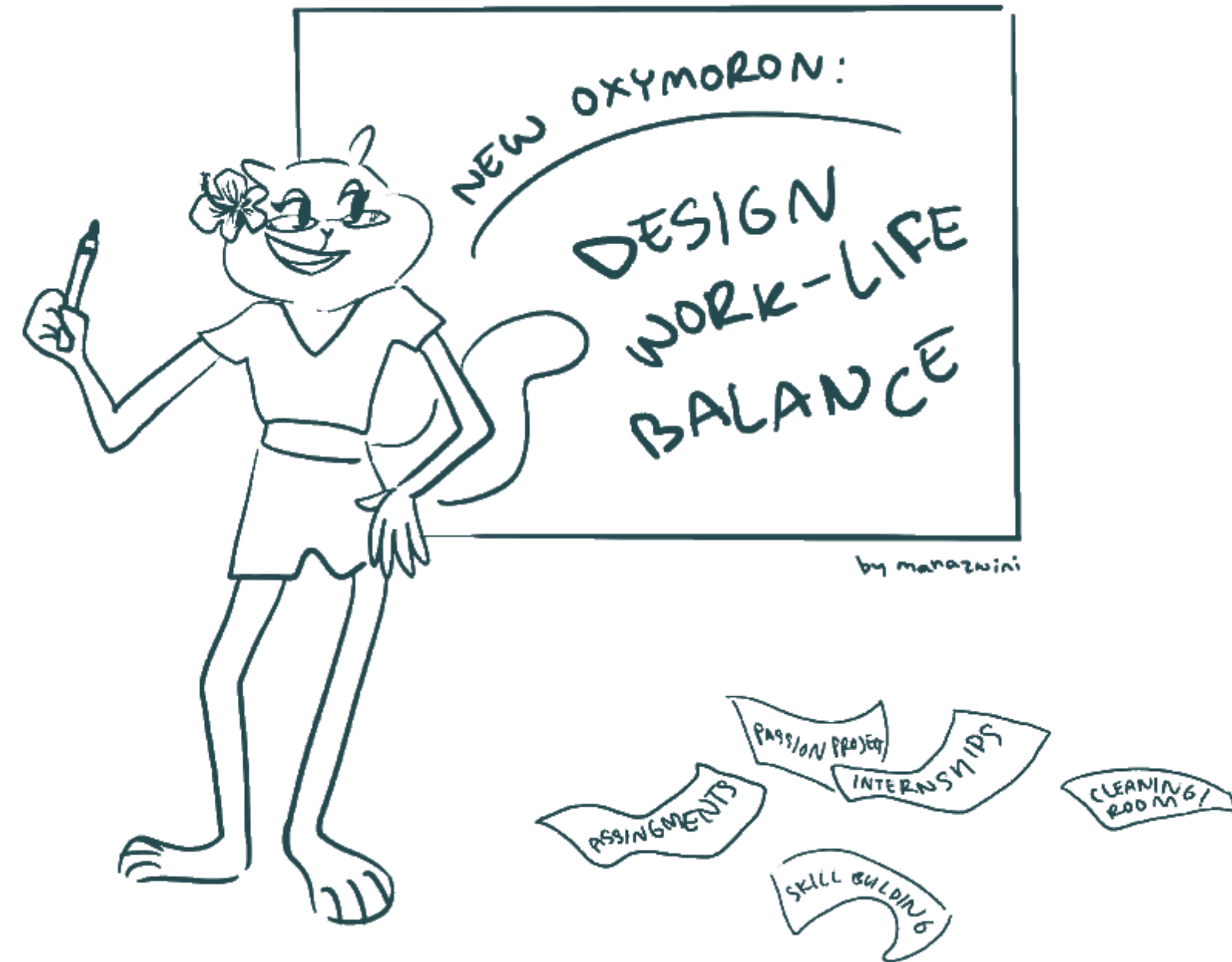
