Academic Calendar

Attendance Requirements

Attendance for all courses is governed by the university's attendance regulations, details of which are available on the university website.

Grading and Academic Performance

The University follows a transparent and comprehensive grading system to assess student learning and academic achievement. Must Have

In cases of unsatisfactory academic progress, the University may place a student under Academic Warning or Academic Probation. Continued poor performance may result in termination from the programme in accordance with the applicable academic regulations.

Academics

Bachelor of Design (B.Des)

The 4-year Bachelor of Design programme combines creativity with practical knowledge, placing design at the intersection of technology, business, culture, and society. Students explore technologies like IoT and AI to solve real-world problems through an interdisciplinary curriculum. With a strong focus on empathy and cultural understanding, they become thoughtful designers who create impactful, user-centered solutions.

Disciplines Offered: Product Design, Interaction Design, Integrated Communication Design, Interdisciplinary Design.

Master of Design (M.Des)

The 2-year composite study programme combines new-age domains with traditional learning approaches. The M.Des curriculum includes hands-on skills courses like design drawing and workshop skills, which involve material manipulations and working with a variety of materials. Students are introduced to critical thinking, culture studies, and communication, and receive foundational knowledge in leadership and entrepreneurship. Additionally, learners are encouraged to write blogs, keep journals, and maintain a sketchbook to foster deeper interest and insight into their subjects.

Departments

At IET, we prepare future-ready engineers through education, research, and innovation in emerging areas such as Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, Cybersecurity, Quantum Technologies, Robotics, Industrial IoT, VLSI & Semiconductor Technologies, and Industry 5.0. Through industry partnerships and experiential learning, students develop the skills to solve real-world challenges while creating sustainable solutions aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Department of Computer Science and Engineering offers contemporary programs in emerging areas such as Artificial Intelligence, Cyber Security, and Data Science, preparing students for rapidly evolving technological domains. The Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering focuses on VLSI design, communication systems, embedded technologies, and interdisciplinary applications, enabling students to build strong foundations in both hardware and software systems. The Department of Mathematics and Applied Sciences strengthens the engineering curriculum through fundamental sciences, analytical thinking, and applied mathematical skills essential for engineering education and research.

Curriculum Overview

The program's curriculum is benchmarked with top institutions across the world and provides students with a rich blend of interdisciplinary skills that are in high demand across industries.

The B.Tech program requires the completion of 160 credits, which are distributed across Foundation Courses, Community Core, Program Core, Specialization Core, Discipline Electives, and Open Electives. These courses are spread across eight semesters, and the details of the semester-wise courses are available in handbooks shared by program coordinators. The contact details for program coordinators for various programs are shown in the directory at the end of the section.

Advanced Labs

Our Computer Science Labs are equipped with state-of-the-art technology, including advanced CPUs and GPUs. These facilities offer a transformative learning environment where theoretical knowledge meets practical application, enabling students to deepen their understanding and proficiency in complex concepts.

AI Lab



The AI Lab is a high-performance computing environment optimised for machine learning, deep learning, and computer vision. Powered by Intel i7 processors, dedicated GPUs, and dual-boot Linux/Windows, it offers industry-standard frameworks like TensorFlow, PyTorch, and OpenCV, providing students with robust infrastructure for research, prototyping, and deployment of next-generation AI solutions.

Data Science Lab



Equipped for large-scale data processing, the Data Science Lab integrates SSD-based systems, Python, R, and advanced libraries for analytics, modelling, and visualisation. With seamless access to cloud platforms and live datasets, it enables students to address real-world challenges across healthcare, finance, marketing and beyond.

Computer Network and Cyber Security Lab



This lab delivers hands-on mastery of network architecture and modern security practices. Dual-boot systems, Cisco hardware, and specialised tools like Wireshark, Nmap, and Packet Tracer enable penetration testing, digital forensics, and vulnerability assessment.

AR/VR Lab



The AR/VR Lab supports advanced 3D modelling, real-time rendering, and interactive experience design. Powered by RTX-class GPUs and platforms like Unity and Unreal Engine, it enables creation of virtual worlds, simulations, and games.

Project Lab



With Intel Core i9 processors, NVIDIA Quadro Pro graphics, 32GB RAM, and SSD storage, the Project Lab supports demanding tasks like AI/ML training, IoT development, full-stack projects, and data-intensive simulations.

Programming Lab



Designed to solidify computational thinking, the Programming Lab offers high-performance systems and multiple IDEs for C, C++, Java, and Python. Students progress from foundational algorithms to advanced object-oriented and data-driven development, bridging theory and practice to prepare for research, competitive programming, and enterprise-scale software engineering.



BYOD Lab



The BYOD Lab is a flexible, high-connectivity workspace optimised for interdisciplinary collaboration. With high-speed wired/wireless access, ergonomic design, and seamless integration with institutional cloud and virtual lab resources, it empowers students to develop, test, and present projects on their own devices in an adaptive, real-world working environment.

Smart Grid Lab



Smart Grid Lab focuses on tackling traditional grid challenges for a sustainable energy future. Equipped with energy test benches, it features a grid emulator, a 1-phase microgrid setup, a 40W solar panel, a 30W wind emulator, converters, hybrid energy storage, and a programmable load.

Circuit Design and VLSI Laboratory



Equipped with 30 computers, this lab is also furnished with Virtex-7 Field Programmable Gate Array (FPGA/CPLD) boards and high-precision multi-channel Digital Storage Oscilloscopes to support comprehensive hardware testing and project development.

Analog and Digital Electronics Laboratory



This laboratory is equipped with Texas Instruments Trainer Kits that incorporate breadboards and power supplies. Students design digital logic or analog circuits using Integrated Circuits (IC) and discrete components. Testing is done using Digital Storage Oscilloscopes and Multimeters.

Embedded Systems and Internet of Things Laboratory



This laboratory is equipped with low-power microcontrollers such as the MSP430 and TIVA boards from Texas Instruments, which are based on Reduced Instruction Set Computing (RISC) architecture and are used for laboratory experiments and student projects.

Communication Laboratory



The Communication Laboratory has Microwave test benches, Optical Fiber Communication setups, and an Antenna Simulator. It is designed to provide practical exposure to analog and digital modulation techniques, time and frequency domain analysis, and wireless communication concepts.



Hackathons

IET actively encourages students to participate in hackathons organized by institutes, industries, and national and international organizations, fostering innovation, problem-solving, and collaborative learning. Over the years, IET students have successfully qualified and excelled in prestigious hackathons and innovation challenges such as Google Summer of Code (GSoC), Formidium DevFes, the Capsule Vision Challenge hosted by Danube Private University, Krems, Austria, LNMIIT GDG Hackathon HackCrux, and the Circular Cities Asia Innovation Challenge.

Additionally, the JKLU Student Council organizes the annual HackJKLU event, which provides students with an opportunity to showcase their technical skills, work on innovative solutions, and engage with peers, mentors, and industry experts.

The Smart India Hackathon (SIH), an initiative by the Ministry of Education, provides students with a national platform to develop innovative and practical solutions to real-world challenges while fostering creativity, teamwork, and industry-academia collaboration.



Workshops and Conferences

Students are encouraged to participate in workshops, seminars, conferences, and training programs that provide opportunities to publish their research work, interact with experts, and gain exposure to emerging technologies and contemporary developments. In the past, students have participated in programs such as the Hypercomplex Seminar organized by the Lodz University of Technology, Poland, and the Samsung Fellowship for Semiconductor Workforce Development, gaining valuable academic and industry-oriented experience.

Practice Schools

Students are provided with opportunities to engage in industry-oriented projects and experiential learning through Practice School I and Practice School II. Practice School I is conducted during the summer break after Semester IV, with a minimum duration of six weeks, while Practice School II is undertaken during Semester VIII for a duration of approximately fourteen weeks. These practice schools enable students to gain hands-on industry exposure, apply theoretical concepts to real-world problems, and develop professional and technical competencies.

The faculty coordinators for the Practice School program regularly share internship and project opportunities with students through email and other institutional communication channels. Students are encouraged to prepare the required documents, including resumes and supporting materials, and apply for suitable opportunities well in advance. Placement preparations are coordinated by the placement coordinators through regular guidance sessions, aptitude training, and facilitation of internship and industry engagement opportunities.

Industry Visits

Periodic visits to industries in and around Jaipur are organized to familiarize students with industrial operations, professional work culture, and real-world engineering practices. These visits provide students with practical exposure to manufacturing processes, emerging technologies, and industry expectations, thereby bridge the gap between academic learning and industrial applications.

Student Support

Support in terms of identity cards, transcripts, no objection certificates for internships, competitive exams, or students' mobility may be obtained from the institute office.

The BBA (Honours) programme is designed to build a strong foundation in management education while allowing students to pursue specialization areas aligned with their career interests and industry trends. The programme focuses on developing managerial competence, business acumen, entrepreneurial orientation, and analytical abilities. Under the multiple-entry and multiple-exit framework, students may exit after three years with a **BBA degree** or continue for the fourth year to earn a **BBA (Honours) degree**.

Specialisations

Marketing

The Marketing specialisation focuses on consumer behavior, branding, digital marketing, sales, and strategic marketing practices. Students gain exposure to market analysis, customer engagement strategies, and contemporary marketing tools.

BFSI (Banking, Financial Services and Insurance)

This specialization equips students with knowledge related to banking operations, financial markets, insurance, investment products, and financial services. The curriculum prepares students for careers in the financial services sector.

Business Analytics

The Business Analytics specialisation introduces students to data-driven decision-making, analytical tools, business intelligence, and interpretation of business data for strategic business decisions.

Entrepreneurship

The Entrepreneurship specialisation is designed to foster innovation, creativity, and an entrepreneurial mindset among students. Through a blend of academic learning and experiential opportunities, students gain practical insights needed to identify opportunities, develop sustainable business solutions, design viable business models, and formulate entrepreneurial strategies to lead ventures in a dynamic and competitive environment.

BBA FinTech

The BBA FinTech programme is designed to prepare students for the rapidly evolving financial technology ecosystem by integrating management education with finance and technology. The curriculum includes interdisciplinary courses that integrate concepts from finance, business, analytics, and emerging technologies.

The programme focuses on areas such as:

- Financial technologies and digital finance
- Banking and financial systems
- Business analytics and financial applications
- Emerging technologies in finance
- Data-driven financial decision-making
- Digital transformation in financial services

Students gain exposure to contemporary developments in the FinTech industry through practical learning, projects, workshops, and industry-oriented activities. Career opportunities include roles in FinTech companies, digital banking, financial analytics, payment systems, blockchain-based businesses, financial consulting, technology-enabled financial services, and related domains.

BBA with KPMG in India Certification

Students enrolled in the BBA / BBA (Honours)/ BBA in Fintech programme may opt for industry-recognized certification modules offered in association with KPMG in India, providing additional professional exposure and enhancing employability in areas such as finance, taxation, auditing, analytics, and consulting.

The programmes are designed to equip students with conceptual clarity, industry-relevant skills, leadership capabilities, and practical exposure through projects, workshops, internships, and experiential learning activities.

Curriculum Structure

The academic curriculum is designed around two key components: In-Class Learning and Out-Class Learning, ensuring students receive a balanced exposure to theoretical understanding and practical application.

In-Class Learning

The in-class component focuses on conceptual understanding, academic rigor, and skill development through interactive pedagogical methods. Students are guided by experienced faculty members through:

- Lectures and interactive classroom discussions
- Case studies and business simulations
- Presentations and group activities
- Research-based assignments
- Analytical and problem-solving exercises
- Inputs from industry experts

The curriculum is designed to foster critical thinking, communication skills, leadership qualities, and managerial decision-making capabilities.

Out-Class Learning

The out-class component complements classroom learning by providing students with experiential exposure and opportunities to apply concepts in real-world settings. Students actively participate in:

- Industry visits and internships
- Workshops and certification programmes
- Live projects and business competitions
- Entrepreneurship and innovation initiatives
- Leadership and team-building activities
- Inter-college academic and co-curricular events

These activities help students develop confidence, teamwork, creativity, networking abilities, and practical business exposure.

Student Engagement and Signature Activities

The Institute emphasizes holistic learning by integrating academic excellence with experiential and industry-oriented activities. Various platforms are provided to students throughout the academic year to enhance creativity, innovation, leadership, teamwork, and practical business exposure.

Start-up Fest

Start-up Fest provides students with a platform to showcase innovative business ideas, interact with entrepreneurs, and develop entrepreneurial thinking through various startup-oriented activities and competitions.

Business Simulation Workshop

The Business Simulation Workshop offers hands-on exposure to managerial decision-making through simulation-based activities that enhance strategic thinking, teamwork, and problem-solving skills.

Praktikum

Praktikum is an experiential learning competition organized for second-year students, where they present their Summer Internship Projects at the beginning of the third year. The event enables students to showcase their industry learning, practical exposure, and project outcomes through professional presentations and evaluations.

Management Conclave

Management Conclave is an inter-college fest that brings together students from various institutions to participate in competitions, management activities, and team-building exercises, promoting leadership, collaboration, and networking opportunities.

Mentoring at JKLU

At JK Lakshmipat University, mentoring is treated as part of how we educate, not as an add-on to academics. A sincere mentoring programme enriches the academic ecosystem of the University, and the regular conversations between a student and a mentor often shape what a graduate goes on to do. The Student Success and Mentoring Committee was constituted to formalise this belief into a campus-wide practice that every student can rely on.



How the programme is organised

We follow a simple three-stage framework that we refer to internally as **AIR: Awareness, Implementation, and Reflection**. Awareness ensures that every faculty member and every newly admitted student understands what mentoring at JKLU means and how to engage with it. Implementation is the on-ground practice that runs through the semester, and reflection is the closing loop where outcomes are documented, shared, and improved upon.

The stakeholders of the programme are wide by design, and include management, faculty, students, alumni, non-teaching staff, and parents, because student success at the University is a shared responsibility.

Mentorship Day and recognition

JKLU celebrates a dedicated **Mentorship Day** once each academic year, built around student-led activities and expert sessions. Dining Mess facility

Students' Code of Conduct

JK Lakshmipat University is committed to fostering a safe, inclusive, ethical, and professional learning environment. All students are expected to familiarize themselves with and adhere to the University's Code of Ethics and Conduct, policies, regulations, and procedures available on the University website. Compliance with these guidelines is a condition of continued enrollment and participation in University activities. Key aspects of student conduct are outlined below.



Presenting Your Professional Best

To foster a professional environment and help students prepare for industry and formal engagements, the University encourages students to wear formal attire during university ceremonies, official functions, industry interactions, presentations, placement-related activities, and other designated formal events. Students are encouraged to maintain a neat and professional appearance during such occasions, reflecting both personal professionalism and the values of the University community.

University Identification Card

Each student is issued a University Photo Identification (ID) Card, which serves as an important means of identification and enables access to various campus facilities, services, and events. Students are encouraged to carry their ID Card while on campus and present it when requested by authorized University personnel for verification purposes. The ID Card is issued for the student's personal use and should be kept secure. Students should not alter, share, transfer, or allow others to use their card. In the event of loss or damage, the matter should be reported promptly to the Institute Office. A replacement ID Card may be issued upon submission of the required request and payment of the prescribed fee.

Substance-Free Campus

To ensure a safe, healthy, and productive academic environment, the possession, consumption, distribution, or use of tobacco products, smoking materials, alcohol, narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances, or any other prohibited substances is strictly forbidden within the University campus and its facilities. Violations will attract disciplinary action in accordance with University regulations and applicable laws.

Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP)

The University ERP system serves as the primary platform for academic and administrative services. Students are responsible for regularly accessing the ERP portal to review attendance records, course registrations, examination schedules, grades, fee information, academic documents, and official notifications.

Students must maintain the confidentiality of their login credentials and are responsible for all activities performed through their accounts.

Safety and Campus Cleanliness

The University is committed to providing a safe and secure campus environment. Fire extinguishers are installed at strategic locations, and security personnel are trained to respond to emergencies. - Violation of intellectual property rights or any unlawful online activity.
- Creation of fake University-related accounts, misuse of the University's name, logo, or identity, or publication of misleading or defamatory content regarding the University or its members.

University email accounts and access to the Learning Management System (LMS) are administered by the IT Section. Requests for specialised academic software should be routed through the concerned course instructor for installation of appropriately licensed software on personal laptops or laboratory systems.

Students must ensure that all software used on devices connected to the University network is legally acquired and properly licensed.

All university students, faculty and staff can enjoy a variety of snacks, tea, and coffee at the cafeteria on payment. Students are expected to use these facilities responsibly, maintain cleanliness, observe facility-specific regulations, and demonstrate courtesy and respect toward fellow users.

Social Media and Digital Communication

Students are encouraged to engage actively in academic and campus life while respecting the privacy, dignity, and intellectual property of faculty, staff, and fellow students. Audio, video, or photographic recording of lectures, classroom activities, or individuals on campus may only be undertaken with prior permission from the concerned faculty member or University authority. Students are expected to represent the University responsibly in all interactions with external organisations and media agencies. Any dissemination of audio, video, photographs, or other content relating to university activities through external media channels requires prior approval from the University.

Examination Conduct and Rules

Students are expected to uphold the highest standards of honesty, integrity, and discipline during all examinations, quizzes, assessments, and academic evaluations. Students must report to the examination venue on time and carry their University Identity Card and any other documents permitted by the University.

The use of unauthorized materials, electronic devices, communication with other candidates, impersonation, copying, or any other form of unfair means is strictly prohibited. Students must comply with all instructions issued by the Controller of Examinations (coe@jklu.edu.in) before, during, and after the examination. Any violation of examination rules or involvement in academic misconduct shall be dealt with in accordance with the University's academic regulations and disciplinary procedures.

Electrical Safety

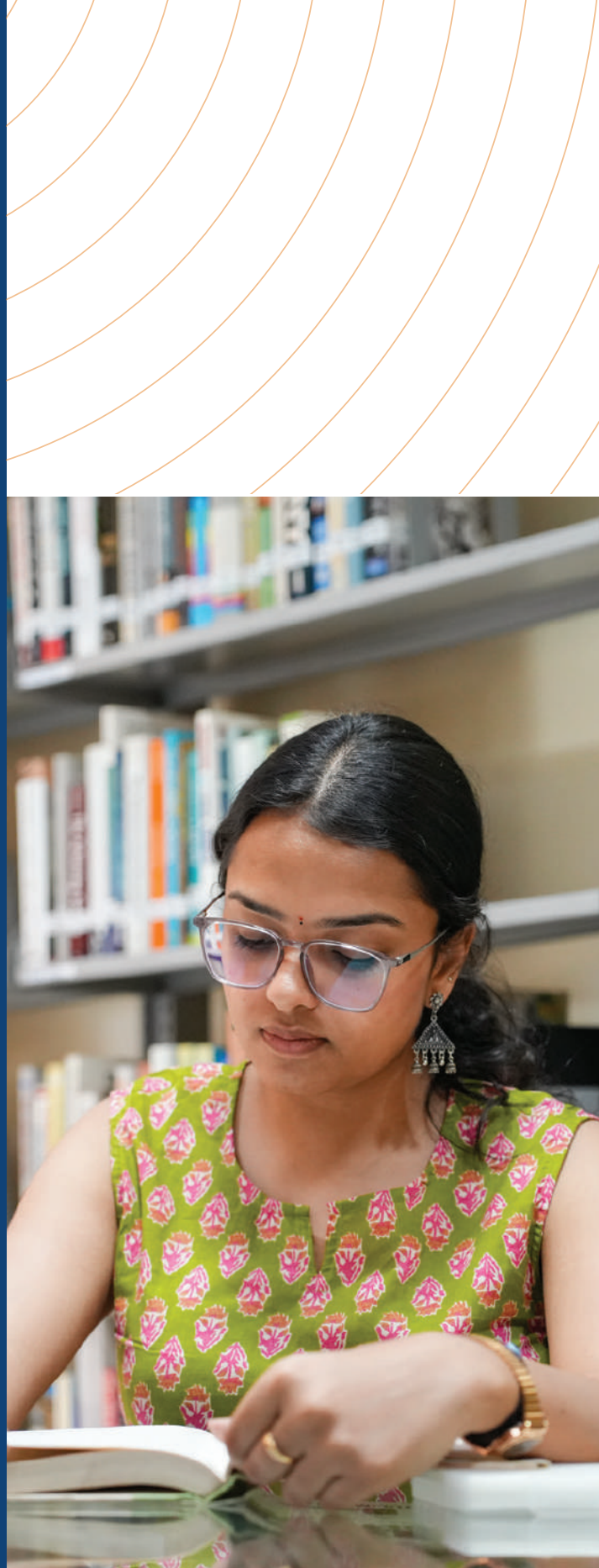

In the event of an earthquake or any other natural calamity, residents should promptly and calmly evacuate the buildings and proceed to the designated assembly areas or open lawns on campus.

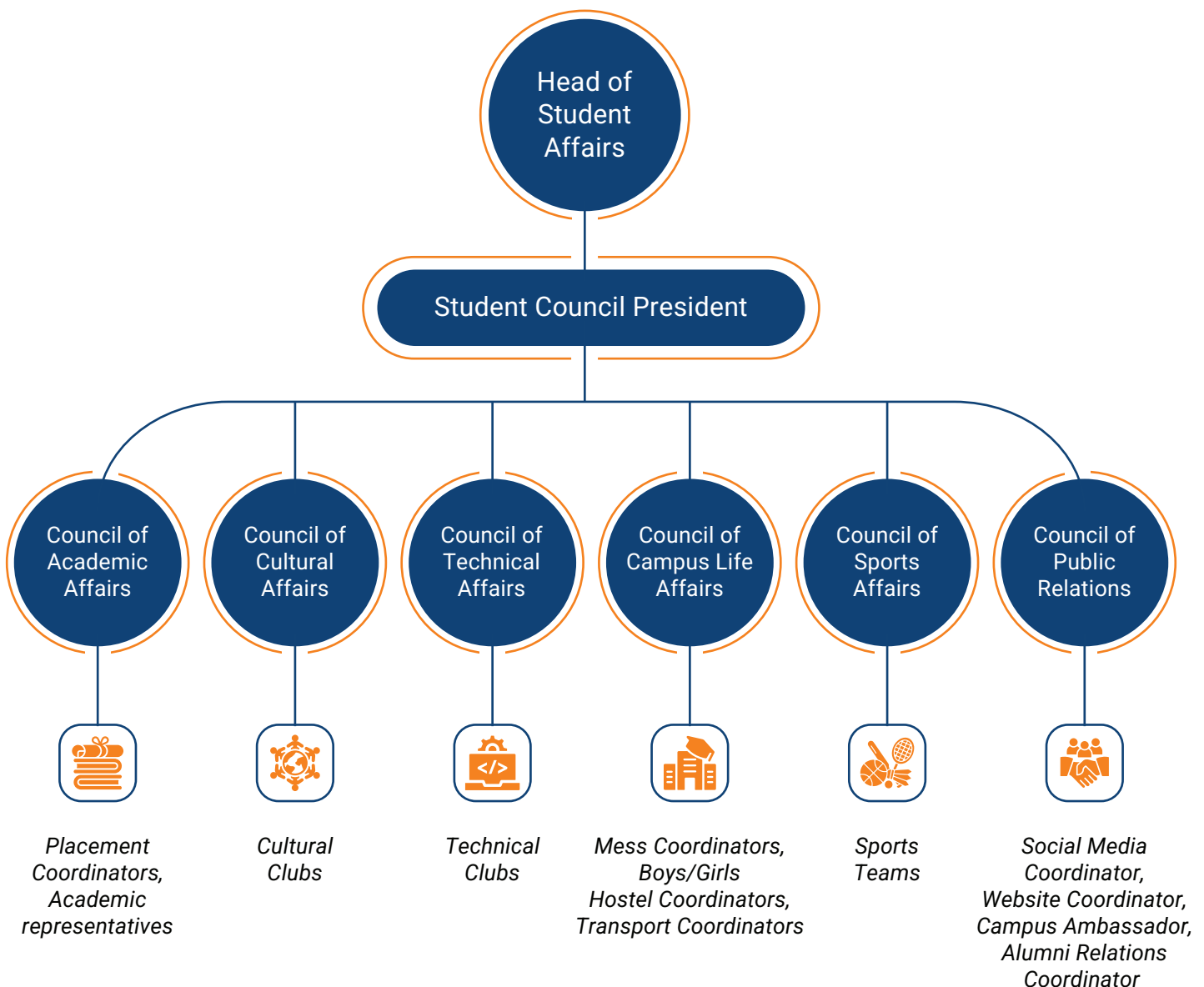
Elevator Malfunction

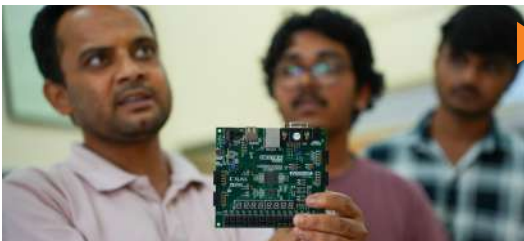


Robotics Club

Students are encouraged to first seek resolution at the appropriate initial level before escalating the matter to the next level, if required. For academic matters, students are encouraged to first contact or meet the respective Institute Dean for guidance and resolution.

For matters related to ragging or violations covered under the Prevention of Sexual Harassment Policy, students may directly approach or write to the respective Committee Chairperson or designated Committee Members. Such concerns will be handled confidentially and in accordance with the applicable University policies and procedures. If the grievance remains unresolved despite being raised and appropriately escalated through the prescribed channels, students may, as a final recourse, write to the Registrar or the Vice Chancellor.

Students' Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC)

The Students' Grievance Redressal Committee is a statutory body established to ensure the prompt, fair, and transparent resolution of student grievances. The Committee addresses grievances related to academic matters, administration, infrastructure, evaluation processes, disciplinary concerns, harassment, and other institutional services. All grievances are acknowledged within a stipulated timeframe, systematically categorized, and forwarded to the concerned departments for necessary action. Where required, hearings and consultations with stakeholders are conducted to ensure a fair assessment. The Committee reviews all findings and submits its recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor for approval. The final resolution is communicated to the concerned students, and proper records are maintained for institutional monitoring and review through IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell).

Scholarships and Fee Payments

Academic fees are payable on a semester-wise basis. Notifications regarding fee payment schedules are communicated to students by the Finance & Accounts Department. The University offers scholarships and financial assistance to students in accordance with the eligibility criteria and guidelines notified from time to time. Scholarship awards, where applicable, may be adjusted only against academic fees and shall not cover any other charges unless expressly specified.

All applicable fees, including tuition, hostel, and transport fees, must be paid at least one week prior to the commencement of the semester to facilitate timely registration. Students intending to avail themselves of education loans are advised to contact their respective Institute Office well in advance to obtain the relevant documents and complete all necessary formalities within the prescribed timelines.

Students are required to adhere strictly to the fee payment schedule prescribed by the University. Failure to pay fees within the stipulated deadlines may attract late payment charges, penalties or other actions as per the applicable university rules and regulations.

Students are advised to retain the payment receipt/transaction reference for future records and verification.

Vehicle Parking and Transport Facilities

Students planning to use their own vehicles are requested to park their vehicles only in the designated parking areas. All vehicle users must adhere to the **speed limits and traffic regulations** prescribed within the campus premises.

The University provides air-conditioned shuttle bus services connecting the campus with key locations across Jaipur, offering a safe, convenient, and reliable commuting option for students. Student Representatives, designated as Single Points of Contact (SPOCs), help ensure the smooth operation of the transport service by coordinating with students, communicating updates, and facilitating the resolution of transport-related concerns.

Transport Policy

- Morning and evening buses are only for users who are paying for the transport service.
- In exceptional situations, hostelers can avail the facility of evening buses and for that students must collect free passes from the respective warden. The warden can issue a maximum of five passes a day.



- No standing passengers are allowed.

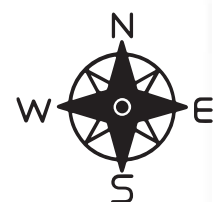
