### Rules for Identification and Classification of Academically Deficient Students

(Applicable for students of all the UG programmes, admitted from 2021-22)

It is necessary that a student demonstrate satisfactory academic performance in his/her programmes. In case of poor academic performance, a student may be placed under Academic Warning, Academic Probation or his/her programme may be terminated, as per following rules.

## 1. Academic Warning:

A student shall be kept on Academic Warning if:

- He/she obtains GPA or CGPA is lesser than 5 at the end of a semester, or
- He/she completes lesser than **s\*20\*0.65** total cumulative credits, where 's' stands for number of semesters normally completed by the students of his/her batch.

In this case, following norms will be applicable:

- a) The student will not be allowed to hold any post for any institute body including the hostel management, students' life, and student council.
- b) The normal academic load for such students shall be 20 credits, which can go up to 24 credits with the permission of the head of the Institute.
- c) The student will be required to sign an undertaking to agree and follow all stipulated conditions of warning. All such undertaking shall be countersigned by the parent/guardian of the student.

#### 2. Academic Probation:

The student shall be kept on academic probation, if he/she continues under Academic Warning for second consecutive semester. In this case, following shall be added to the norms for academic warning:

- a) Maximum academic load for such students shall be 20 credits in his semester of study
- b) The student will not be allowed to represent the University in any event/activity outside the Institute.

#### 3. Termination:

# 3a. For First year:

If a student fails to complete at least 50% of the credits for all the courses offered in first year, he/she shall be terminated from the programme. However, if semester drop permission has been granted to the student, then in order to continue in the programme, he/she must complete at least 65% of the credits for all the courses offered in the other semester.

## 3b. For Subsequent years:

Second year onwards, if a student fails to come out of academic probation after two consecutive semesters, he/she will be terminated from the programme.
